

## **José Miguel Pérez-Sierra, conductor**

Musical Director of the Teatro de La Zarzuela in Madrid, Musical and Artistic Director of the Royal Opera Festival in Krakow and Principal Guest Conductor of the Amigos de la Ópera de A Coruña season, the Spanish conductor José Miguel Pérez-Sierra shot to fame internationally after becoming the youngest conductor to take the podium at the ROF, the Rossini Opera Festival in Pesaro (Italy), where he conducted *Il viaggio a Reims* in 2006. That was the beginning of a vertiginous career which has taken Pérez-Sierra to theatres and auditoriums of Spain, Italy, France, Germany, Poland, Portugal, Georgia, Uruguay, Canada and Chile, among others, conducting an extensive opera and symphonic repertoire.

He studied with Gabriele Ferro for four years and was his assistant at the San Carlo Theatre in Naples, the Massimo in Palermo and the Real in Madrid. He also studied with Gianluigi Gelmetti (Accademia Chigiana, Sienna) and Colin Metters (Royal Academy, London), to later become Alberto Zedda's assistant from 2004 to 2009. In 2009 and 2010 he was Zedda's assistant conductor at the Plácido Domingo Centre de Perfeccionament at the Palau de les Arts in Valencia. Much earlier, as a child, he began his musical studies by focussing on the piano with José Ferrández, a student of Claudio Arrau. He also studied virtuosity and musical phenomenology with José Cruzado. From 2009 to 2012 he had a close and fruitful relationship with Lorin Maazel, which was fundamental to Pérez-Sierra's training, attending his rehearsals both in Valencia and Munich.

His debut as a conductor was in 2005 with the Orquesta Sinfónica de Galicia and since then he has been a regular guest conductor at the Teatro Real and Teatro de las Zarzuelas in Madrid, in addition to the Palau de les Arts de Valencia, Gran Teatre del Liceu in Barcelona, Ópera de Oviedo, Ópera de Las Palmas, Ópera de Tenerife, Asociación Gayarre de Amigos de la Ópera in Pamplona (AGAO), Teatre Principal in Palma (Majorca), Abao Bilbao Opera, Opéra de Marseille, Théâtre des Champs Elysées, Opéra de Montreal, Teatro Municipal in Santiago de Chile, Royal Opera Festival in Krakow, Rossini Festival in Wildbad, Städtische Theater Chemnitz, Teatro San Carlo in Naples, Festival Puccini in Torre del Lago, Auditorium Comunale in Sassari, Teatro Verdi in Trieste, Festival de la Côte Basque in Saint-Jean-de-Luz and the Opéra de Massy and the Opéra-Théâtre in Metz (France), among many others.

Maestro José Miguel Pérez-Sierra's 2024-2025 season include *La bohème* at the Ópera de A Coruña; *Marina* at Teatro de la Zarzuela; *La verbena de la Paloma* at Palau de les Arts in Valencia; *Maria Stuarda* at Teatro Real; *Turandot* at Theater Basel; Mahler's *Symphony № 9* with the Kraków Philharmonic Orchestra; *Aida* at FC Metz Stadium with the Opéra-Théâtre de Metz Métropole Company; and *La tabernera del Puerto* at Teatro de la Zarzuela, among other engagements.

In the 2023-2024 season he conducted *Aida* opening the Amigos de la Ópera de A Coruña season; *Il Tabarro* and *Gianni Schicchi* at the Ópera de Oviedo; *Dialogues des Carmélites* at the Opéra de Massy; *Samson et Dalila* at the Ópera de Tenerife; a Gala concert at the Ópera de A Coruña with Marina Monzó y Miren Urbieta-Vega; a concert alongside the soprano Lise Davidsen at Teatro Real in Madrid; *Madama Butterfly* at

Teatro Coccia in Novara; Mahler's *Sixth Symphony* with the Filarmónica de Málaga; *La verbena de la paloma* at Teatro de la Zarzuela; Falla's *La vida breve* at Opéra-Théâtre de Metz; *Luisa Fernanda* with the Krakow Philharmonic Orchestra and Choir; Rossini's *Messa di Gloria* and *L'Italiana in Algeri* at Royal Opera Festival in Krakow; Rossini's *Messa di Gloria* and *L'Italiana in Algeri* at Rossini Festival in Wildbad; and Bizet's *Carmen* at Quincena Musical in San Sebastián.

Highlights of recent seasons include *I puritani*, *L'elisir d'amore*, *Maria Stuarda*, *Lucrezia Borgia*, *La sonnambula* e *Il barbiere di Siviglia* at ABAO Bilbao Ópera; *La cenerentola* in Montréal; *Turandot*, *L'elisir d'amore*, *Aida* y *La bohème* at Las Palmas; *Samson et Dalila* in Tenerife; two Rossini concerts at Théâtre des Champs-Élysées in Paris; *Il signor Bruschino*, *Armida*, *La scala di seta*, *Matilde di Shabran*, *L'equivoco stravagante*, *Aureliano in Palmira*, *Messa di Gloria* and *L'Italiana in Algeri* at the Rossini Festival in Wildbad; *Il signor Bruschino*, *Armida*, *La scala di seta*, *El Barberillo de Lavapiés*, *Luisa Fernanda*, *Messa di Gloria* and *L'Italiana in Algeri* at the Royal Opera Festival in Kraków; *Il turco in Italia*, *La cenerentola*, *Il barbiere di Siviglia* and *L'Italiana in Algeri* en la Ópera Nacional de Chile; *La donna del lago*, *Armida* and *Les Huguenots* at the Opéra de Marseille; *Rigoletto* y *Dialogues des Carmélites* at Opéra de Massy-París; *Carmen*, *Tosca*, *Il trittico*, *Il turco in Italia*, *El amor brujo* and *La vida breve* at Ópera de Metz; *Les pêcheurs de perles*, *Il tabarro* and *Gianni Schicchi* at Ópera de Oviedo; *Don Fernando el Emplazado* (Zubiaurre), *Viva la Mamma!* And the Gala Concert of the International Opera Awards at the Real in Madrid; *Pagliacci*, *Norma*, *Aida* and *La bohème* at Ópera de A Coruña; *Carmen* with the Orchestre Philharmonique du Luxembourg; the Verdi *Requiem* with the Teatro Real Orchestra and Chorus; *Madama Butterfly* at the Gran Teatre del Liceu; besides, he has conducted concerts alongside Lise Davidsen, Mariella Devia and Roberto Alagna.

Some of the orchestras with which he habitually collaborates include the Sinfónica de Madrid, Orquesta de la Comunidad de Madrid, Orquesta de Radio Televisión Española (ORTVE), Sinfónica de Galicia, Orquesta de la Comunitat Valenciana, Oviedo Filarmónica, Sinfónica de Navarra Pablo Sarasate, Euskadiko Orkestra Sinfonikoa, Sinfónica de Castilla y León, Sinfónica de Tenerife, Filarmónica de Gran Canaria, Filarmónica de Málaga, Orquesta de Córdoba, Simfònica de les Illes Balears, Orchestre Philharmonique du Luxembourg, Orchestre National d'Ile-de-France, Sinfónica de Tbilisi (Georgia), Filarmónica de Montevideo, Filarmónica de Santiago (Chile), Robert Schumann Philharmonie, Orquesta del San Carlo de Nápoles and Virtuosi Brunensis, among others.

José Miguel Pérez-Sierra's discography includes a monographic CD by Illarramendi (*Symphonies 4 and 9*) with the Euskadi Symphony Orchestra (Sony), a recital with the mezzo-soprano Marianna Pizzolato (Naxos), the operas *Adelson e Salvini*, by Bellini (Bongiovanni), *Ricciardo e Zoraïde*, *Matilde di Shabran*, *Aureliano in Palmira*, *L'equivoco stravagante* and *La scala di seta* and *Armida*, by Rossini (Naxos), *Manon Lescaut* on DVD from the Teatro Massimo Bellini in Catania (Unitel) and a CD with the baritone Vittorio Prato with bel canto repertoire (Illiria).
